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Overview of the Elementary Configuration

Beginning in the fall of 2010, the Pine Plains Central School District will implement a new configuration that affects all students in the elementary grades. The new configuration will create two specialized schools. The Cold Spring Early Learning Center will be dedicated to students in the primary grades, K-2, while the Seymour Smith Intermediate Learning Center will specialize in the intermediate grades, 3-5.

The new configuration was designed to address growing concerns regarding equitable class size, services for students with special needs, effective use of resources, fiscal responsibility and meeting the District mission statement and Board of Education (BOE) goals.

As the 2010 calendar year begins and the implementation draws nearer, parents are urged to keep informed of BOE meetings, informational sessions and other services available. In addition to a special monthly newsletter being sent home with students for the remainder of the school year, information will also be available on our website at www.ppcsd.org.

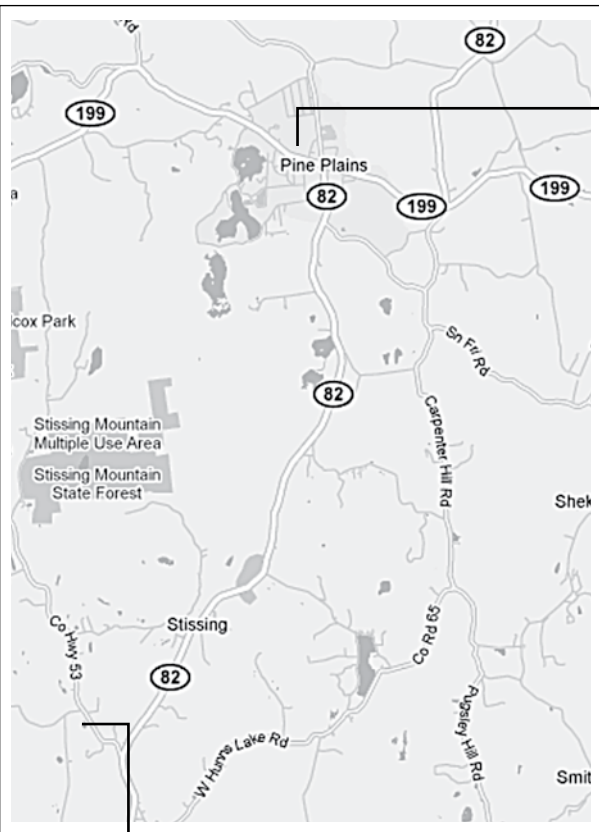
Preparing Students for the New Configuration

The new configuration will provide a great opportunity for students to meet and learn with their peers from all over the community. For some, it will mean a new school building and a new principal. There are exciting changes for all children, since there will be new classmates to meet and learn about.



In order to prepare students for the new configuration, there are a number of orientation activities planned throughout this school year and into the fall. Students are currently being introduced to the configuration via each school's newspaper. There are also pen pal activities between the schools using both written and video communication. Building principals are spending time at each facility so students can become familiar with both of them.

Additional activities are being planned and will be updated on the District website and via the new monthly Elementary Configuration Newsletter, which will be sent home with students. Some of these activities may include a joint field day, joint field trips and special school assemblies during the first week of school. Building Leadership Team Addresses Concerns

One of the ways that the District has addressed the needs and concerns of the configuration was to establish a joint Building Leadership Team (BLT). The team is comprised of faculty members representing all grade levels and both libraries, administrators and parent members representing both schools. The BLT has met on several occasions and continues to meet to assist in the implementation of the new configuration.

The BLT has several subgroups designed to address specific issues. The Student Subgroup is designed to assist in smoothing the transition. Their tasks include creating a timeline of activities that encourages interaction between students in both facilities, including pen pal letters, joint field trips, joint school assemblies, and open house events.

The Parent Subgroup is designed to help parents better understand the configuration. The subgroup is planning a parent orientation calendar and joint activities.

The Faculty Subgroup focuses on creating a consistent curriculum for the students in both schools. They are also helping to plan the physical move as well as staff support workshops.

Transportation for the New Configuration

There have been many questions and concerns regarding the transportation arrangements for the new configuration. The safe and efficient transportation of our students is of paramount importance to the District. We have spent much time optimizing the transportation models to minimize travel time for the students. Here are the highlights:

- Hours at Seymour Smith (grades 3-5) will be 9:00 AM – 3:15 PM.
- Hours at Cold Spring (grades K-2) will be 9:15 AM – 3:30 PM.
- Breakfast programs are available at both locations.
- The transportation model for the new configuration (2010-2011) has all bus routes operating less than 60 minutes. Therefore, no student will be on a bus route longer than 60 minutes.
- Students may have different routes to and from school to minimize travel times.

- Bus routes will be determined, alternate requests processed and final routes and bus numbers will be sent via letters mailed to parents in August 2010.

- The shuttle bus between schools will be eliminated because special education students will no longer need to be transported to Seymour Smith for classes.

- The direct routes will take students residing the farthest from their building straight to school. The combination routes will stop at both schools for those students that live nearest to the buildings.



The following is a summary of the route configuration for 2010-2011:
